Many students waste valuable time trying to locate where their lectures are being held. I will ensure that an up-to-date timetable is printed and displayed at the entrance of the School of ICT, making it easier for students to find their classes without hassle.

## 5. Burden of Excessive Assignments

Some students have expressed concerns about the overwhelming number of assignments in certain courses. I will work with the President and lecturers to propose a limit on the number of assignments per course, allowing students to manage their time effectively across all subjects.

#### 6. Tutorial Classes

Having already organized tutorial sessions in the areas of Linear Algebra and Programming, I am committed to expanding this initiative, especially for new intakes, to ensure they receive the support they need from the very start.

In the short term, my focus will be on resolving the issue of missing grades, ensuring timetable accuracy, and addressing course collisions.
